Careers at KORI

KORI includes team members in support of First Nation-directed research. The positions require a secondary education and passion for learning and serving the communities.

- Community Research Mentor support community researchers with training, and resources for local priorities. Visit and engage communities and find new projects and funding for local initiatives.
- Project Manager Coordinate research projects including budgeting, contract workers, reporting and liaising with funders.
- Research Intern manage individual projects and coordinate video conference events and training.
- Student Placements learn technical skills and contribute to community research projects.
- Research Director Guide research practices, privacy and accountability, liaise with community leadership, funders and academic partners.
